

Willis Jenkins is Margaret Farley Assistant Professor of Social Ethics at Yale Divinity School. At Yale he is also a faculty member of Berkeley Divinity School and has a secondary appointment to the Yale School of Forestry & Environmental Studies. He writes in several areas of Christian social ethics and theology, including environmental ethics, missiology, global ethics, and urban theory. His book, *Ecologies of Grace: Environmental Ethics and Christian Theology* won a Templeton Award for Theological Promise.

Jenkins has significant mission experience. In 1997-8 he was a Volunteer for Mission of TEC working with the Church of Uganda as a teacher in a rural seminary. From 1998-2003 he worked for the companion relationship of the Dioceses of West Ankole (Uganda) and Oklahoma, serving as an Appointed Missionary to the companionship from 2000 to 2003. In 2000 Jenkins helped start the Episcopal Young Adult Service Corps and served as its Associate Coordinator until 2004. He was a member of the Standing Commission on World Mission from 2000-2006.

Jenkins is a member of St. Paul's and St. James' Episcopal Church in New Haven, and a founding member of the outdoor Episcopal chaplaincy in New Haven, Chapel on the Green.
