Dear Colleagues and Friends,

Collaboration has been the key theme of 2017 for the College for Bishops (CfB).

- We continued our collaborative work with the Episcopal Church Foundation (ECF) and the Office of Pastoral Development of the Episcopal Church through the popular and substantive work of Project Resource 2.0. Our goal is to reach all Dioceses with this valuable information and accompanying support structures. Please see the article on Project Resource 2.0 in this edition!
- The Diocesan Leadership Initiative is a collaboration among CfB ECF, and The Office of Pastoral Development made possible through a Lilly Grant to ECF. This initiative is for 15 Diocesan Teams, and it will be held in September 2018.
- Bishops and Dioceses have been not only generous in their annual
 giving to the support of our work, they have been collaborative
 in offering insights into and information on emerging and
 innovative success stories that are being disseminated to the larger
 Church through our courses, and The Leadership Institute.
- The Leadership Institute, a monthly electronic summary of the "best" being offered within the Church and society, continues to be very popular, and many Bishops are now making this material available to the clergy of their Dioceses. We would like to encourage wide distribution of these materials.
- The collaborative research project entitled, "Fundraising Practice within Majority Christian Communities of Color" with the

Vandersall Collective was initiated after the first Project Resource Session in 2015. More news about this exciting effort will be given during the March meeting of the House of Bishops.

Our conference offerings remain strong as shown in the "end of conference evaluations." While the faculty has virtually remained constant, there have been some significant additions over the past year, particularly for the New Bishops' and Spouses' Conference. We, also, continue to have Bishops from around the Communion participating, including Bishops from Canada, Wales, and Scotland in the Living Our Vows Program for New Bishops.

On July 1, 2017, Bishop Matthews retired from his work with the Office of Pastoral Development, and as a staff member of the Church Center. As of the same date, he began working part time for the College for Bishops only. The CfB is a Non-Profit Religious Organization.

As you read this annual report containing more details of our work over this past year, think of the robust Board that remains committed to the mission of the College "to provide quality formational and educational opportunities for Bishops and others of this Church, as well as for Churches in Communion with this Church."

THE MISSION OF THE COLLEGE FOR BISHOPS

To provide opportunities for education and formation that will strengthen bishops in their personal lives, as diocesan leaders in God's mission and in their vocation to God as a community of bishops in service to the Episcopal Church.

PROJECT RESOURCE

Project Resource is an annual conference and collaborative effort sponsored by The College for Bishops, The Episcopal Church Foundation, and The Episcopal Church Office of Development.

Many churches find their mission crippled because they cannot raise the money and people they need to resource the mission to which they are called. Because Diocesan funds often emerge from church budgets, the Diocese may, too, find itself similarly crippled by a lack of resources.

Project Resource is designed to turn a Bishop Diocesan into a team leader of resource developers—teachers each of whom has the training and digital resources to lead any church in any situation concerning resource development of money, vision, or people—three great resources of a Church's mission. There may be reasons that mission is confined, but money need no longer be one of them. This project puts resident teachers on the ground in your Diocese so that Churches get the help they need in stewardship development.

A collaboration such as this has never been done before by the Church in this way. Never has a training manual been designed in order to provide print and digital resources that you may use to teach the essentials of financial development for all sizes and sorts of Churches in your Diocese as well as customize to your own context. We are working to change a culture.

There have been 3 Project Resource conferences since the original one in 2015. As of December 2017, 36 Dioceses have been trained in Project Resource. After the 2018 conference, just shy of half of the Dioceses in the Episcopal Church will have attended Project Resource.

The April 2018 conference is designed specifically for small, under-resourced Dioceses. The College must raise \$75,000 for these financially challenged Dioceses to attend this conference. With the support of the Dioceses of Alabama, Connecticut, Long Island, Massachusetts, New York and Wyoming, and with personal support from Mr. Leslie Callahan and The Rt Rev'd Mary Glasspool, we have raised \$45,000 of the needed scholarship money. We welcome any contributions toward meeting this goal!

2017 COLLEGE FOR BISHOPS PROGRAM REPORT

90-Day Companion Program: assigns Bishop companions to Bishops-elect to assist them in the transitional period between election and consecration.

• 4 companion relationships were established in 2017

New Bishops' and Spouses' Conference: assists the newly-elected Bishops and their spouses in forming community and examining the transitional issues each is facing as he or she enters a new location with new expectations and new responsibilities.

• 15 Bishops and 10 spouses were in attendance

Living Our Vows Residency: provides opportunities for new Bishops to gather in community, to reflect on the gifts, power and authority of the episcopate and to acquire resources to lead and serve Dioceses effectively and faithfully.

 June 2017–25 participants (including participants from Canada and El Salvador) **Living Our Vows Peer Coaching:** provides a three-year collegial relationship for new Bishops that supports spiritual health and personal development to ultimately equip new Bishops with skills for transformative leadership.

• 25 coaching relationships continued or began in 2017

Project Resource: provides teaching, focus and resources so that a team (one Bishop, two clergy, two lay leaders, one Diocesan communications person) may return to their Diocese equipped to teach and lead locally in areas of resource development.




